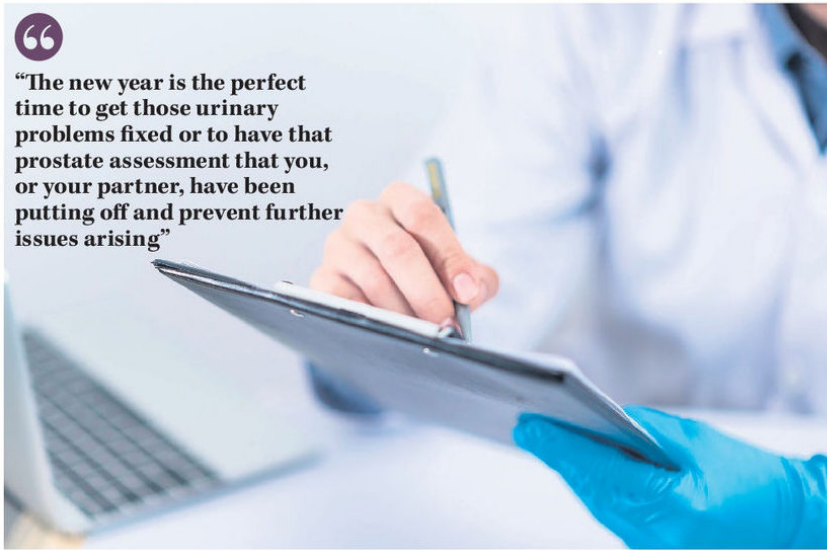

Men's health and the prostate – time to get it checked

Prostate problems are very common and affect men more as they get older. These can range from inflammation and benign enlargement to cancer, and symptoms can significantly impact on quality of life

Bothersome urinary symptoms affect four out of 10 men over the age of 50 and three out of four men in their 70s. These symptoms are usually due to benign prostatic enlargement and can be easily improved through medication or minimally invasive surgery. Occasionally, they're caused by prostate cancer. Prostate cancer is the most common cancer in males in the UK, with incidence rates on the rise. While there's no national screening programme in place for this, an initial assessment can be easily done through a blood test (PSA) and examination.
