FAQs

What does a skin excision involve?

The procedure is usually carried out under local anaesthetic, which will sting briefly, and takes between 15-45 minutes depending on the size and site of the excision.

Your Consultant will cut around the skin lesion and then remove it, closing the cut with stitches, which are often dissolvable. Depending on the site non-dissolvable stitches may be used. After five to fourteen days the nurses at KIMS Hospital will remove any remaining stitches.

What is the recovery period?

You will be able to go home a short while after the operation. You should be able to return to work the next day and carry out your usual activities. However, depending on the size and site of your operation you may not be able to drive or perform physical work for one to two weeks. Your Consultant will discuss this with you.
